or it's down the drain!

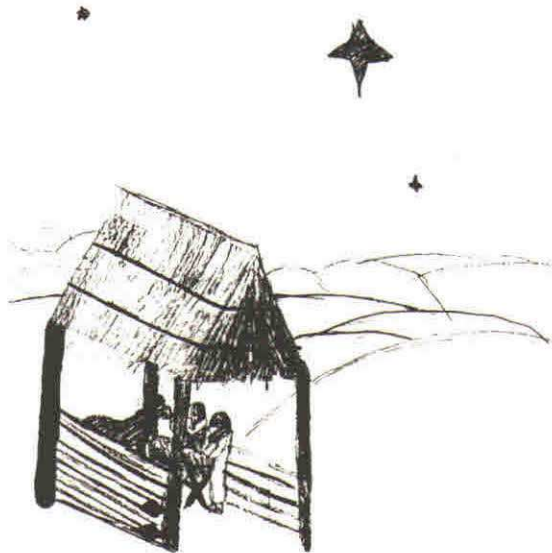
Down come the rainforests

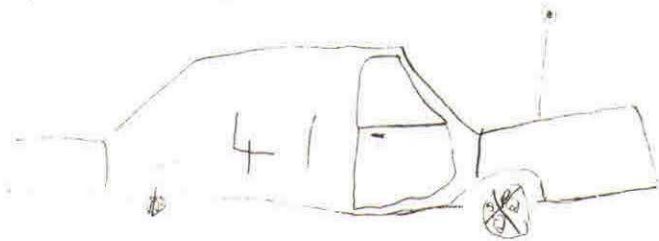

Last week I went to Arabia to stay with my brother.

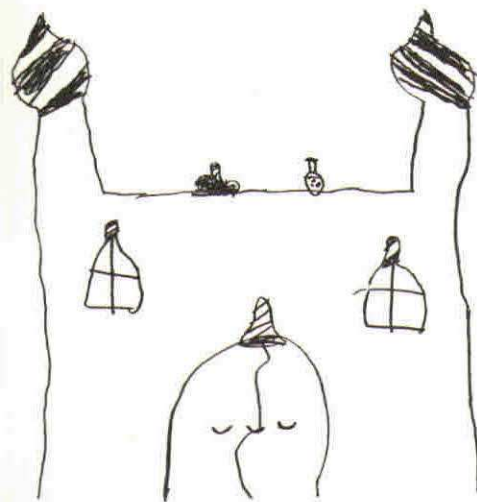
